ICAS is an online academic competition that is designed to assess students' higher order thinking and problemsolving skills in English, Mathematics, Science, Writing, Spelling Bee and Digital Technologies. Students in Year 2 to Year 6 can participate.

Each assessment celebrates students' accomplishments by providing opportunities for recognition and development. Every student who participates will receive a printed certificate and an online results report. Top performers will be eligible for medals.

The aim of our project is to create a garden full with a diverse range of edible fruits and vegetables that can be maintained by our students. The children will be involved in creating a garden that is free from weeds and grass and full of edible plants.

The children will learn how to plant a seed, watch it grow, and consume the fruit and vegetables that it grows. The expected (environmental and educational) outcomes of the project include: lifecycle education, the duration and effort it takes into growing healthy food and making right food choices.

The students will learn the lifecycle of the plant, learn about sustainability, and how rubbish and the environment negatively impact the food we consume.
