CLASSES HAVE SETTLED IN WELL

We have formed 26 classes which is two above our entitlement. The average class size Kindergarten to Year 2 is 20 & 25.4 in Year 3 to 6. Total enrolment is currently 532. Our Inclusive Classes are into routines with 21 students currently enrolled bringing our total student enrolment to 553.

IMPORTANT REMINDERS

• Parents must provide an explanation for student absences within 7 days from the first day of any period of absence.

• Family holidays during the school term should be avoided if possible. Days off for this purpose (an official exemption is needed) count as absences, are recorded on school reports and also disrupt schooling.

• For safety reasons, the teacher's car park is **NOT** to be used as a thoroughfare by students or community members at any time.

• If students bring mobile phones to school they must be handed in at the School Office before school and collected at the end of the day. Student phones must remain off whilst on school grounds. Failure to do so will mean your parent will need to collect your phone from the office.

• Medication (apart from that stipulated in a Health Care Plan developed by parents, doctor and the school) is not to be administered by any school staff, without written permission by the parent.

Our restorative space is an area where teachers and students can meet and talk about strategies and positive behaviour for learning.

UTS STEM X PROGRAM

BRPS has been selected to participate in a program organised by the University of Technology Sydney. This initiative invites 16 girls from Years 5 and 6 to participate in the Women in Engineering Stem X program. This is a program that will occur weekly. The students engaged in their first session last week at BRPS and are heading to their next session at the University on Tuesday 21st February.





KOORANA – CHILD AND FAMILY SERVICES

Each Kindergarten and Year 1 class will be visited by an occupational therapist, physio therapist and speech therapist for approximately an hour. Essentially the classes will be observed on 3 separate occasions.

Therapists will be observing students while they carry out their normal classroom activities. Therapists may ask the teaching staff to have the students sit or stand or perform a particular task as part of the observation.

Once whole class observations are completed across the first 1 to 2 weeks, students requiring further assessment will be identified and parents will be engaged and asked to sign consent forms to allow for further assessment.

RESPECT

BRPS are fortunate again to part of the RESPECT Program. This is a program for boys in Year 5 and 6, nominated by their teachers. The program is led by Outloud.

Outloud is a youth arts organisation based on Darug land in Bankstown, Western Sydney. They provide dynamic, socially-driven arts opportunities for young people in our community.

This program teaches students the importance of respectful and productive relationships. A significant part of the program is where the students consolidate their learning by authoring lyrics and prepare a performance which they will share with the community, when complete.

Knowing, valuing and caring for all students The Inclusive, Engaging and Respectful schools package includes three new policies that help our schools manage the diverse spectrum of student needs to improve outcomes for all students in every public school across New South Wales.

The new policies, framework and procedures aim to strengthen the engagement and participation of all students, including those with disability, complex and challenging behaviours and additional needs.

The three policies are -

- Inclusive Education Policy for students with disability
- Student Behaviour Policy and Procedures; and the
- Restrictive Practices Framework and Restrictive Practices Reduction and Elimination Policy and Procedures.

These policies work together to support the inclusion and engagement of students. They will ensure schools are in the best position to help all students reach their full potential across the entire NSW public education system.

As we unpack these policies, parents and caregivers will have opportunities to consult with school staff.

SCHOOL BYTES - NEW REPORTING SYSTEM

This year we will be using a different system to produce our school reports.

Once we have finalised the new template it will be shared with the community. The new report will have many similarities to the existing report template.

School Bytes is also an interactive finance system. Further information will be emailed to families in the next few days.

Respectful communication is a right
