Payment is due tomorrow, Thursday 27/03/2025 for Stage 2 Sydney Harbour Excursion.




HOMEWORK FOCUS

ATTENDANCE SMS

YEAR 3 – 6 CROSS COUNTRY at GOSLING PARK WEDNESDAY 9TH APRIL

A note will be emailed to all Year 3-6 parents. We ask that parents inform the school if there are updated medical needs for your child ie; asthma, allergies.

All parents are welcome. Students will complete the course of roughly 1.5km – 2km in either:

The online process will guide you through your options and collect the information required to make the process as smooth as possible.

Overview

Banksia Road Public School is committed to explicitly teaching and modelling positive behaviour and to supporting all students to be engaged with their learning.

Our goal is to inspire every child to participate positively in the school community and beyond. We focus on promoting excellence, opportunity and success for every student, every day. We value and strive to develop safe, respectful learners in a caring learning community.

Principles of positive behaviour support, trauma-informed practice, inclusive practice, and social emotional learning underpin our daily practice. High expectations for student behaviour are established and maintained through effective role modelling, explicit teaching, and planned responses.

Our school mission is "Students first and foremost".

To achieve our mission, key programs prioritised and valued by the school community are Positive Behaviour for Learning, PAX the Good behaviour Game and our Portrait of a Graduate:

Positive Behaviour for Learning (PBL)

At Banksia Road we are "Good as Gold" and implement the Positive Behaviour for Learning framework to support student wellbeing and engagement.

PBL aims to combine initiatives and agreed perspectives (or values) into a school-wide system that offers a common language and consistency in teacher practice to support the social, emotional and academic success of students.

- PAX Good Behaviour Game
- Portrait of a Graduate Our 'Portrait of a Graduate' identifies the core values we aim to instil
 in our students by the time they leave Banksia Road Public School. This document was
 created in collaboration with students, parents and staff.

Our values within our Portrait of a Graduate include

- Being Safe through self-regulation, resilience, empathy, being informed.
- Being Respectful through inclusiveness, politeness, honesty, responsibility, care and compassion, accountability, emotional intelligence.
- Being a Learner through innovation, motivation, perseverance, critical and creative thinking, flexible and adaptive thinking, problem-solving and collaboration.

BEHAVIOUR CHECK-IN

All staff engaged in an afternoon session to discuss our approaches to addressing behaviour.

Updates and changes will be made to our School Behaviour Support and Management Plan and an introduction of a flow chart for students and staff to follow.

There has been an increase in the following behaviours across the school

- Absconding (leaving the classroom without permission)
- Pushing, shoving and punching especially during and after a game of soccer or football.
- Continuous disrespectful language and comments made to students and staff members.

These behaviours will be addressed as they arise for any individual who refuses to follow BRPS rules and expectations of being a SAFE RESPECTFUL LEARNER!

PAX GBG IMPLEMENTATION



All teachers have implemented PAX Vision, PAX Leader and PAX Quiet.

Our PAX Vision was co-created with all students within the classroom. Its sets out and clearly state what we want to see, do, feel and hear more of with in the classroom and also what we want to see, do, fell and hear less of. These PAX visions are visible in all classrooms.

We regard, all our students as PAX Leaders.



PAX Leader

- PAX Leaders actions are identified inside and outside the classroom.
- Teacher redirects disruptive or disengaged students by identifying alternative PAX Leader behavior.



 When prompted, students identify qualities or behaviors of PAX Leaders in themselves and others in a variety of activities or settings.



- PAX Quiet is used to gain attention before class-wide instructions and announcements.
- Students respond quickly to PAX Quiet and follow through with instructions.



 Teacher gains full attention and thanks students or corrects students and practices the process again.

At BRPS are working on building consistency from classroom to classroom, teacher to teacher and student to student.

All school leaders are also participating in additional training- PAX Heroes.

PAX Heroes provides PAX teachers and PAX Partners with Tier 3 strategies to promote the success of the students who struggle the most. Ultimately, this benefits not only the student who is struggling, but also the teacher and the other students. Using PAX Heroes reduces the frequency and time the teacher has to deal with episodes and breakdowns from students who are struggling.
